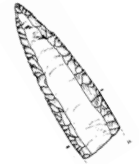




Dig History!

WHO: Children ages 11 to 17 years.

WHAT: A week-long DAY camp program.

WHEN: June 14 - 18, 2010

9:00am—4:00pm, not an overnight camp

Monday through Friday

WHERE: All camps take place on the grounds of Hickory Hill, 502 Hickory Hill Drive, Thomson, GA.

COST: \$50 per week per child.

NOTES: Students should bring a sack lunch and water bottle each day. Snacks are provided twice daily. Activities frequently take place outside.
